Entrance Sign & Landscaping

In the meantime, please do not disturb the new plantings, which will take one-three years to fully establish.

Lighting

Many of our existing lamp posts have been replaced with brighter LED lights. We are compiling estimates to add additional lights around the cluster and will discuss further at our next board meeting.

Drainage

Phase II proposal of the multi-year drainage plan (behind units 2136-2194 Glencourse Ln) is with the engineer and Reston Association for consideration. The BoD is considering implementing a combination of French drains and rain gardens to improve drainage while enhancing landscaping behind the homes. Thank you again for your patience!

Zika Virus Prevention

This mosquito species prefers to lay eggs in artificial containers holding even small amounts of water (i.e. toys, tires, flower pot saucers, buckets, tarps, corrugated downspout extensions.) What you can do:

- Eliminate standing water. Check your yard weekly!
- Treat standing water that cannot be eliminated with larvicide.

- Wear insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus or IR 3535. If using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first, then repellent.

- Zika is most dangerous to pregnant women, however anyone can contract the virus. Symptoms may include fever, rash, muscle and joint pain, pink eye, headaches lasting up to a week.

Lyme Disease Prevention

Lyme disease is spread through the bite of an infected blacklegged tick (deer tick). Only the blacklegged tick can transmit the bacteria that causes Lyme disease. What you can do to avoid tick bites:

- Avoid wooded/bushy areas with high grass/ leaf litter.
- Use repellent containing DEET or picaridin.
- Wear long, loose-fitting, light colored clothing.
- Do a thorough check of yourself and others within two hours of leaving wooded areas.

- Properly and promptly remove ticks. See below: www.fairfaxcounty.gov/hd/westnile/tickremoval.htm

- Symptoms may include a bull's-eye rash, fever, headache, achy muscles and joints, fatigue.
